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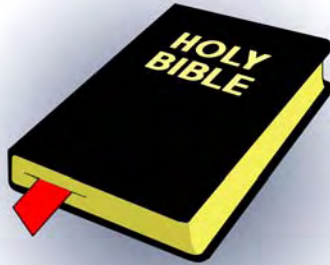
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## **Some Pastors are in Great Danger, of God's judgement, for ignoring to warn the people.**

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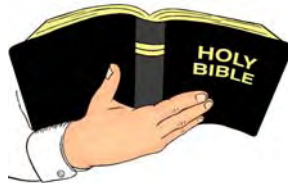
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## Some Pastors are in Great Danger, of God's judgement, for ignoring to warn the people.

A Pastor can be held responsible, before God, for the sins committed by other people. A pastor is a watchman, for the souls of his congregation. He is required, by God, to preach and warn his congregation about sin, and its eternal consequences. If the pastor sees (*is aware of*) sin in his congregation (things contrary to the will of God), and doesn't warn (*or preach to*) the people about it, the Pastor is also held responsible for the sin.

Some Pastors need to repent, and start fulfilling their required responsibilities.



**“7 So thou, O son of man, I have set thee a watchman unto the house of Israel; therefore thou shalt hear the word at my mouth, and warn them from me.**

**8 When I say unto the wicked, O wicked *man*, thou shalt surely die; if thou dost not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked *man* shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at thine hand.**

**9 Nevertheless, if thou warn the wicked of his way to turn from it; if he do not turn from his way, he shall die in his iniquity; but thou hast delivered thy soul.”**

Ezekiel 33:1-20

“1 ¶ Again the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,

2 Son of man, speak to the children of thy people, and say unto them, When I bring the sword upon a land, if the people of the land take a man of their coasts, and set him for their watchman:

3 If when he seeth the sword come upon the land, he blow the trumpet, and warn the people;

4 Then whosoever heareth the sound of the trumpet, and taketh not warning; if the sword come, and take him away, his blood shall be upon his own head.

- 5 He heard the sound of the trumpet, and took not warning; his blood shall be upon him. But he that taketh warning shall deliver his soul.
- 6 But if the watchman see the sword come, and blow not the trumpet, and the people be not warned; if the sword come, and take *any* person from among them, he is taken away in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at the watchman's hand.
- 7 So thou, O son of man, I have set thee a watchman unto the house of Israel; therefore thou shalt hear the word at my mouth, and warn them from me.
- 8 When I say unto the wicked, O wicked *man*, thou shalt surely die; if thou dost not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked *man* shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at thine hand.
- 9 Nevertheless, if thou warn the wicked of his way to turn from it; if he do not turn from his way, he shall die in his iniquity; but thou hast delivered thy soul.
- 10 ¶ Therefore, O thou son of man, speak unto the house of Israel; Thus ye speak, saying, If our transgressions and our sins *be* upon us, and we pine away in them, how should we then live?
- 11 Say unto them, As I live, saith the Lord GOD, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live: turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways; for why will ye die, O house of Israel?
- 12 Therefore, thou son of man, say unto the children of thy people, The righteousness of the righteous shall not deliver him in the day of his transgression: as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall thereby in the day that he turneth from his wickedness; neither shall the righteous be able to live for his *righteousness* in the day that he sinneth.
- 13 When I shall say to the righteous, *that* he shall surely live; if he trust to his own righteousness, and commit iniquity, all his righteousnesses shall not be remembered; but for his iniquity that he hath committed, he shall die for it.
- 14 Again, when I say unto the wicked, Thou shalt surely die; if he turn from his sin, and do that which is lawful and right;
- 15 *If* the wicked restore the pledge, give again that he had robbed, walk in the statutes of life, without committing iniquity; he shall surely live, he shall not die.
- 16 None of his sins that he hath committed shall be mentioned unto him: he hath done that which is lawful and right; he shall surely live.
- 17 Yet the children of thy people say, The way of the Lord is not equal: but as for them, their way is not equal.

18 When the righteous turneth from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, he shall even die thereby.

19 But if the wicked turn from his wickedness, and do that which is lawful and right, he shall live thereby.

20 Yet ye say, The way of the Lord is not equal. O ye house of Israel, I will judge you every one after his ways.”

Do all the youth, in your church, truly understand that fornication is sin (rebellion against God)? Do they truly know the consequences of fornication? Even though it's the parent's and everyone's responsibility to teach them about fornication/sin, their pastor is the watchman for their souls. His job is to study the Bible, and to make sure, all the people in his congregation know which things are sin, and sin's eternal consequences.

Are you (pastor) diligently striving to teach and warn people about sin, and sin's horrifying consequences? Or are you wilfully choosing not to warn them, in order to keep them content and coming to church? Are you going to be held responsible, before God, for the unrepented sins in your congregation, because you failed to teach the people about the various kinds of sin? You see, people need to know, which things are sin, in order to repent of them? And how will they know, unless you tell them?

The people also need to be taught, how they can have their sins forgiven, and how their sins are removed from their life, in Jesus Christ.
